



# Organisations Offering Support and Training

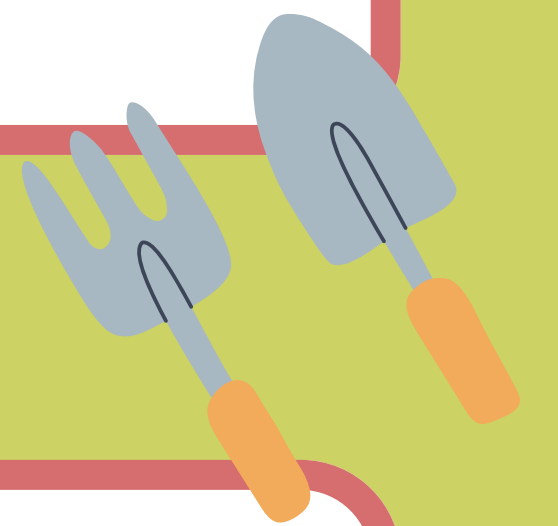
